2006 SuperNOFA Results

Congratulations to all of you involved in bringing HUD homelessness funding to your communities in 2006. Once again, our region did very well in HUD's competitive SuperNOFA process, bringing important resources to the Bay Area and demonstrating HUD's continued confidence in the work we are doing. Your work to bring in much needed federal funding is making a big difference!

Overall, the eleven-county San Francisco and Monterey Bay Area received **\$68,230,419** for the 2006 round, slightly up from the **\$ 68,173,999** received in 2005. Unfortunately, not all CoC nor program applying for funding received the financial support needed to end the misery of homelessness for those in their communities. Nationally 22 Continua of Care and 415 programs were not funded. This speaks to our need to be diligent in advocating for more funding for housing!

In the eleven-county Bay Area, there were a total of 262 awards given in 2006, up from 235 in 2005. Of these, 251 were renewal grants to sustain existing programs, while 11 were grants for new program capacity.
